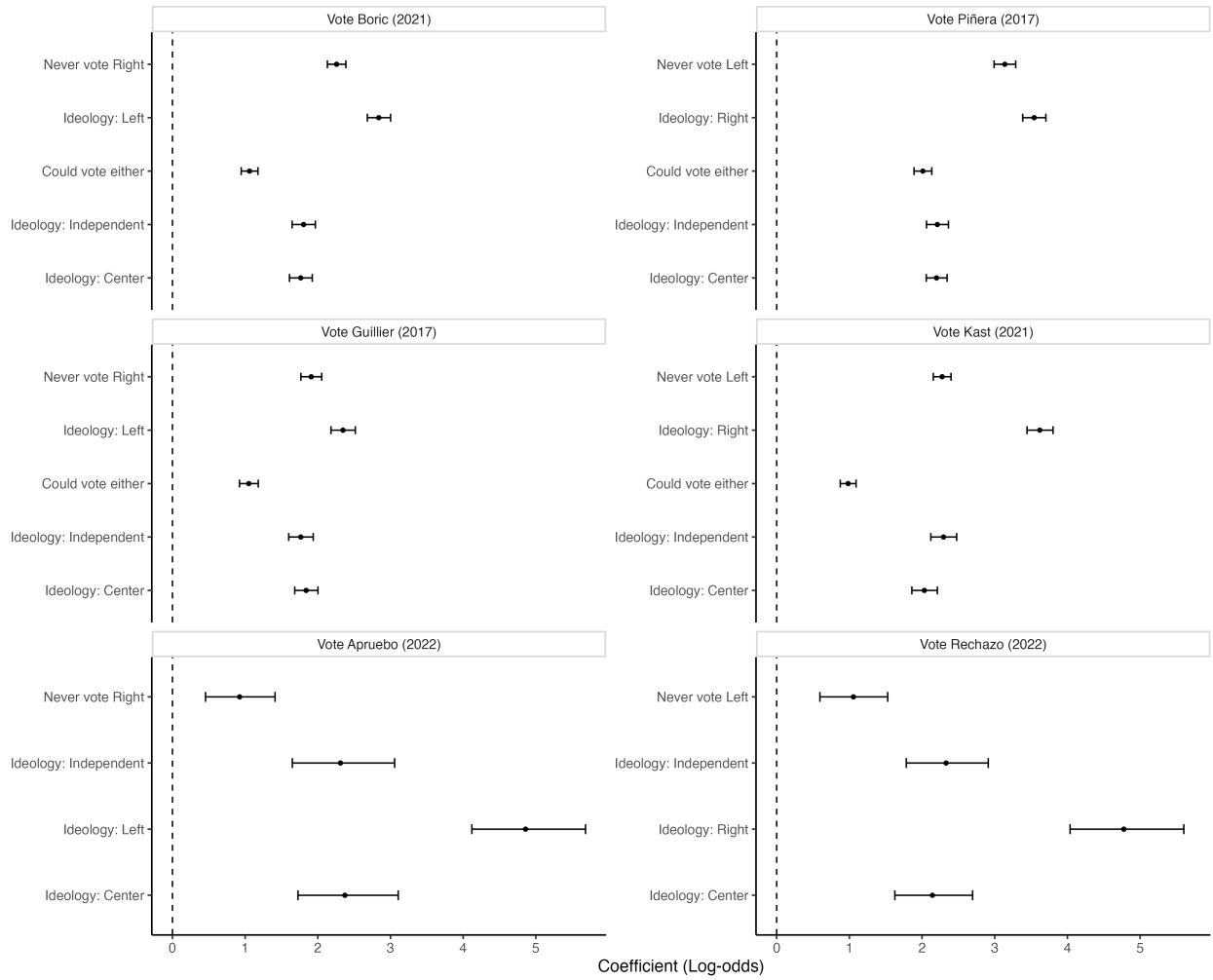


Figure A1: Ideology Versus Anti-Partisanship: [Argote and Visconti \(2025\)](#) data

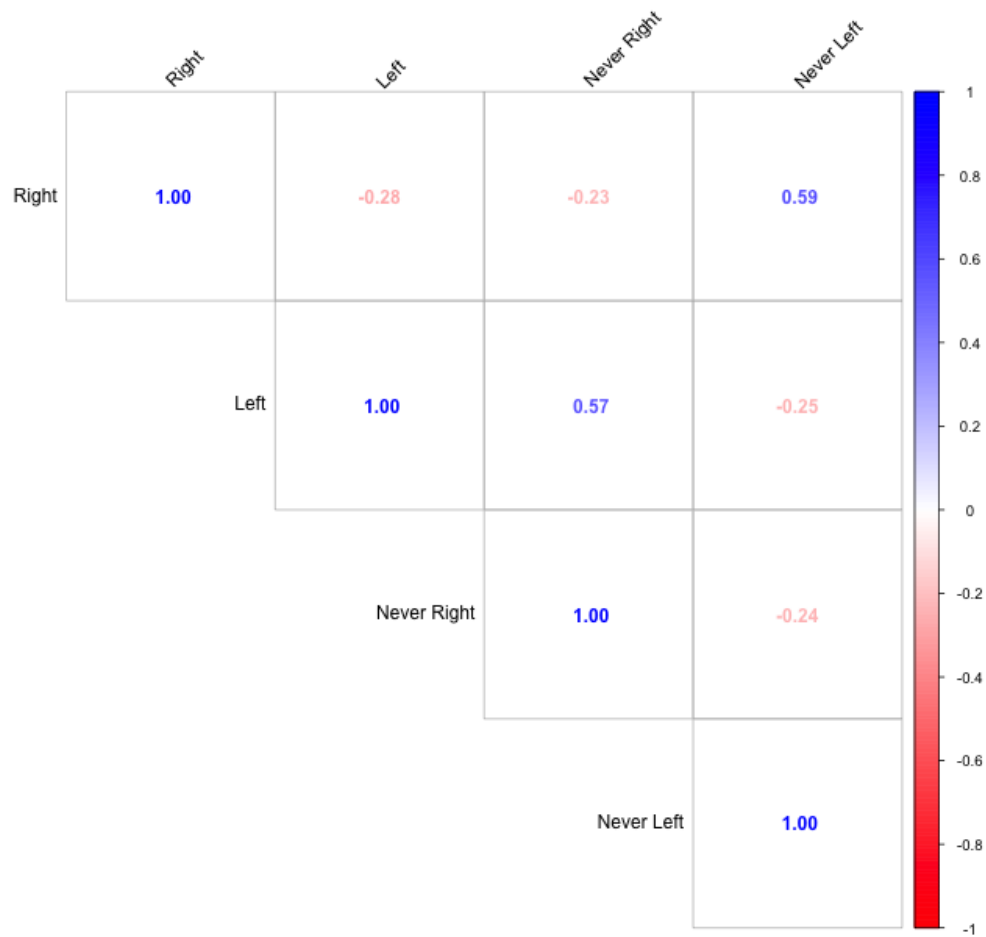


Figure A2: Correlation Matrix Ideology and Negative Partisanship [Argote and Visconti \(2025\)](#) data
